Introduction

Through a public records request, I obtained from the Office of Governor Bob Taft "all petitions or letters sent to [the Governor's] office regarding the death penalty and the use of the death penalty in connection with the disturbance at the Southern Ohio Correctional Facility in Lucasville, Ohio." It is estimated that approximately 26,000 individuals signed these petitions and letters.

Staughton Lynd and I obtained lists of the jurors in the cases of various men who were convicted of offenses committed during the uprising at the Southern Ohio Correctional Facility in April 1993:

In addition, we obtained the names of the forepersons of two Scioto County Grand Juries that issued the indictments.

The objective was to see whether any of the persons who served on juries had signed petitions or letters indicating their support of the death penalty. Four names on petitions appeared to match the names of jurors: two of the jurors who convicted Eric Scales, and two of the jurors who convicted Orson Wells.

Methodology

In order to make manageable the task of comparing the names of jurors with the huge number of signers of petitions, I developed the following methodology.

First, I identified the postal zipcodes for each of the counties listed above. I then sorted the petitions and letters by zipcode, eliminating petitions where the signers obviously did not reside in any of the relevant counties.

Next I took a map of Ohio and made lists of cities and towns that were within each county, and a "not applicable" list of cities and towns where signers who did not live in any of the relevant counties.

In addition to an alphabetical list of the jurors in each individual defendant's trial, I made an alphabetical list by last name of all jurors of defendants in Hamilton County, and an alphabetical list by last name of all the jurors of all the defendants. Finally, and most usefully, I made an alphabetical list by first names of all the jurors. It was not long before I could remember that there were six Davids but none with last names that began with A through E or after the letter M, there were no Edwards, no Johns, there was only one Susan, there were three Barbaras, etc. So any Susan with the wrong last name could be skipped, but better check the last name of every Barbara. Furthermore, if the first or last name was difficult to decipher, I could at least tell that it was too long or did not have the necessary letters to make a match.

I began with counties that had the least number of petitions, and proceeded to the huge number from Scioto County and from Lawrence County adjacent to the east. There were no addresses for many of the signers and those had to be checked by name. When a possible match was found, the address also had to be checked and in a few cases eliminated as too remote. Thus, both name and location were taken into account in preparing lists of relevant signers.

During the screening process, it became apparent that some of the officers who had been hostages, a few additional officers injured during the uprising, and many persons with the same last names had signed petitions. Similarly, some SOCF employees and many people with the same last names signed petitions. And finally, many people with the same last names as some of the jurors signed petitions. Signers who did not live in the county where the case was tried were disregarded.

For Scioto County, I put in separate piles petitions signed by: a) jurors; b) hostages, other officers who testified at the Lucasville trials, and persons with the same last names; c) other SOCF employees and persons with the same last name; and d) persons with the same last name as Scioto County grand or trial

jurors. In some cases, persons in more than one of those categories signed the same petition so those had to be moved from one pile to the next as the lists were being made.

My husband and I then sought confirmation that the signatures of individuals who signed the petitions were in all probability the same individuals who served on juries. A colleague in Scioto County compared the signatures on the petitions with voter registration cards at the Bureau of Elections in Scioto County.

For example, the first name listed on the "venire" for the trial jury in <u>State v. Scales</u> is "Susan Elaine Lute, 1436 Fifth Street, West Portsmouth, OH." The voter registration signature for Susan Elaine Lute at 1436 5th Street, West Portsmouth, OH matches the signature of "Susan Lute, West Portsmouth, Oh" on one of the petitions. Copies of page 1 of the "venire" in <u>State v. Scales</u>, and the petition signed by Susan Lute are attached.

Also attached, by way of illustration, is a copy of a petition signed by the following officers: "Mike Hensley, Hostage"; "Darrold R. Clark, Jr. hostage"; "Jeff Ratcliff exhostage"; "John Kemper HOSTAGE"; and Larry E. Dotson who was also a hostage.


